CCECE 2014, Call for Papers Original Full Length papers due December 20, 2013 via on-line submission at http://ww.ccece2014.org/ London Section and PES Chapter supported conference: "Grid Resilience Through Energy Storage in Southwest Ontario" November 20th, 2013 in Sarnia, Ontario On September 30, 2013, WIE organised an event where Ms. Celia Desmond - the President of World Class Telecommunications and the former President of IEEE Canada and Region 7 Director - was invited to deliver a lecture on "A Rewarding Career in Engineering". The event was inaugurated by Mr. Murray MacDonald who introduced Ms. Desmond to the audience. Total 18 visitors including 10 IEEE members and 8 guests were present there. Ms. Desmond took the audience through a brief journey of her career path explaining how IEEE helped her to shape it. Then she addressed the critical issue of lower number of women representation in the academia as well as in the industry related to Engineering. She discussed several aspects of the problem by highlighting unemployment numbers, less number of girls opting for engineering career, gender pay gaps and women leaving engineering in mid-career for various reasons. All the facts were validated by using thought-provoking statistics

collected from US Department of Labour, Education and NSF. Finally she concluded the talk in an optimistic mode followed by a display of books written by her on Project Management and on her passion of Doll-making. In a nutshell, the event was well-accepted since the whole experience was of overwhelming feeling of encouragement by the insights of the experience and wonderful speech of Ms. Desmond.

## Western ECE Symposium

Western ECE Symposium, sponsored by the London IEEE CS/SMC affinity group, was held on July 25-26th. This event offered graduate students from the department of Electrical and Computer Engineering an opportunity to present their research in a public platform. The two day event featured presentations from 58 students from several specialties, ranging from software engineering to power systems engineering. Keynote talks were presented by Dr. Sourajeet Roy and Mr. Murray MacDonald on the 25th and 26th respectively. Sourajeet was recently hired as a tenure track professor at Colorado State University. Based on his research experience and recent job search, Sourjeet presented tips for success in academia and the academic job search. Murray has 30+ years of experience in the telecom power industry. Murray discussed engineering as a process and presented guidance for building a successful career in industry. The keynote talks were well attended and highly valuable to the grad student community, many of whom are soon pursu-

ing careers in academia or industry.
